What does GAMMA do?

GAMMA is an important, but often misunderstood, part of the Greek community.

GAMMA, which stands for Greeks Advocating Mature Management of Alcohol, was established as a patrolling body inside of the Greek Community. The need for such a body was made clear: as long as we were unwilling to police ourselves, the University and the City were going to do it for us. GAMMA does its best to ensure that the Social Code is being followed by patrolling events, making observations, and giving suggestions to chapters if they think a policy is not being fol-

lowed. Contrary to what you might believe, the social code is not an arbitrary set of rules, but a document spelling out how to ensure your chapter can best comply with local and state laws. The most important factor though, is when GAMMA does their job, the Office of Student Conduct steps back, and Chapters are more likely to follow the rules, stay off of social probation, and stay on campus.
